GCSE German Years 10-11

- This is a two year course which incorporates all the topics, vocabulary and grammar which you have already learnt in Years 7 to 9.
- You will expand and consolidate your prior knowledge using the four skills - listening, reading, writing and speaking - which you have already been using at KS3.
- The four skills will be tested in four separate question papers.
- The specification covers three distinct themes. These themes apply to all four question papers.

How is the exam made up?

- **There are 4 exams - listening, speaking, reading and writing.**
- **Each exam is worth 25% of the total GCSE mark.**
- **All exams are taken at the end of Y11. There are no controlled assessments or coursework.**
- **You can either do all foundation papers (grades 1-5) or all higher papers (grades 4-9).**

Paper 1

Listening

Written exam

- 35 minutes for Foundation Tier, 40 marks.
 - or
 - 45 minutes for Higher Tier, 50 marks.
- No dictionaries allowed.
 - 5 minutes reading time of the question paper before the listening stimulus is played.
 - Section A, questions in English to be answered in English.
 - Section B, questions in German to be answered in German or non-verbally (ie letters / numbers).

Paper 2

Speaking

Oral exam

- 7 to 9 minutes for Foundation Tier plus preparation time.
- or
- 10 to 12 minutes for Higher Tier plus preparation time.
- 60 marks for each Foundation Tier and Higher Tier.

- No dictionaries allowed.
- Role-play
- Photocard
- General conversation

Paper 3

Reading

Written exam

- 45 minutes for Foundation Tier.
 - or
 - 60 minutes for Higher Tier.
 - 60 marks for each Foundation Tier and Higher Tier.
- No dictionaries allowed.
 - Section A, questions in English to be answered in English.
 - Section B, questions in German to be answered in German or non-verbally (ie letters/numbers).
 - Section C, translation from German into English.

Paper 4

Writing

Written exam

- 1 hour for Foundation Tier, 50 marks.
- or
- 1 hour 15 minutes for Higher Tier, 60 marks.

- No dictionaries allowed.
- Foundation:
 - Question 1, short message.
 - Question 2, short passage
 - Question 3, translation from English into German.
 - Question 4, structured writing task.
- Higher:
 - Question 1, structured writing task
 - Question 2, open-ended writing task.
 - Question 3, translation from English into German.
